Focus: A music programme

BLUES BAND

In this lesson, students listen to *In & Around Spain*, in which Justin talking about a blues band who has recently visited Madrid and Barcelona. He tells us about the leader of the band, Stoneking; his style of music, the instruments he plays. He reviews the Spanish concerts and some of the songs on two albums.

The audio is divided into 4 sections. The key activities are:

- finding out about the programme ex 1
- finding out about the topic ex 2
- tuning into the speaker's voice -ex 3
- identifying noun phrases exs 4,5,6
- listening for specific information exs 7,8
- remembering key facts while listening 9,11
- guessing the meaning of new words and phrases ex 10

The final section (*Thinking about Listening*), gives students the opportunity to review strategies and to listen to the complete text again. They should end the lesson feeling confident that they have understood most of the text, and can download the audio for extra listening practice outside class. There are many other music-related English language podcasts available on the Spanish national radio station.

Read the questions and options to check your students will understand the language on the page before you teach the lesson. You don't need to pre-teach vocabulary from the audio text - guessing meaning is integral to the listening activities. Check vocabulary after students have referred to the different sections of the audio script.

Remember to make sure students will be able to see the audio script at different points during the lesson.

Optional extra language focus: after ex 4, word order in noun phrases.

Audio 1

... the pre-war acoustic Hokum, Calypso and Dixieland and jazz-inflected blues of C.W. Stoneking, the Australian born son of American parents, who grew up, down-under, listening to his father's old blues albums of Mississippi Delta figures like Charlie Pattern.

Audio 2

C.W. Stoneking visited Spain not long ago for his first two performances here, in Barcelona and in Madrid. The Madrid concert at the Wurlitzer Ballroom was completely sold out. So, it's to be hoped that Stoneking will return to Spain with his Primitive Horn Orchestra in the near future.

Audio 3

After releasing *King Hokum*, in 2006, to critical acclaim, Stoneking released *Jungle Blues*, whose title track we've just been listening to, in 2008, on the King Hokum Records label. Many of the album's 10 tracks were penned by C.W. Stoneking, who is the main vocalist on all but one, *Housebound Blues*, in which his wife, Kirsty Frazer, sings about the plight of the mother forced to remain at home, with a crying baby, while her husband is out on the town, drinking and having a good old time.

(sound – baby crying, music)

Kirsty Frazer, singing those *Housebound Blues* for her husband C.W.Stoneking and the rest of the Primitive Horn Orchestra backing her up. On this, and his previous album, C.W: Stoneking plays the guitar, the tenor banjo and the washboard, as well as singing. That previous album, *King Hokum*, opens with an acoustic blues track called *Way Out in the World*.

Audio 4

C.W. Stoneking with *Way Out in the World* from his debut album of original work, *King Hokum* released in 2006, and rereleased in Europe in 2007 on Switzerland's Voodoo Rhythm label. C.W. Stoneking has already attracted a substantial following in Britain and other places, and his two recent concerts in Spain were great successes, so, he may well develop a strong following here as well. And we'll wrap up this edition of *In and Around Spain* with another track from *Jungle Blues*, Stoneking's latest album, a tune about an encounter with a talking lion, his *Talking Lion Blues*.
